**SCK•CEN**, the Belgian Nuclear Research Centre, was created in 1952. SCK•CEN is a foundation of public utility with a legal status according to private law, under the tutorial of the Belgian Federal Minister in charge of energy. About 600 employees realise a turnover of 80 MEUR.
